<p align="center"><b><u>Task 1: English</u></b></p> <p>Draw a picture of your favourite page in a book of your choice. Label the picture with adjectives to describe the scene. Remember adjectives are describing words e.g. 'sparkly or dull'. Can you use those adjectives to write sentences about your chosen book? E.g. 'The fairy wore a sparkly dress and shiny shoes.'</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 2: Phonics</u></b></p> <p>Begin to learn the Year 1 common exception words. Make sure you are practising writing them neatly, and using them in sentences. If you don't know the meaning; check it in a dictionary or online. Make sentences by cutting out the bricks. You can use the lists to help you learn the spellings.</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 3: Reading</u></b></p> <p>Read for 10 minutes, at least 5 times a week. Make sure that you are reading clearly, sounding out all of the phonemes. Keep this recorded in your Reading Record.</p> <p>Take on our Year 1 Reading Challenge!</p> <p>Remember to keep track of the books you have read.</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 4: Maths</u></b></p> <p>Learn your 2 times tables. Make sure you can count in 2s and multiply by 2! Practice counting in 2s with objects around the home, such as socks or shoes!</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 5: Maths</u></b></p> <p>Early Bird Maths practice!</p> <p>An Early Bird Maths grid will be sent home weekly, the questions remain the same but the number will change. Please send this back to school the following week.</p> <p>Your child can answer the questions in the blank space on the bottom of the sheet.</p> <p>Please remember to name their work</p>
<p align="center"><b><u>Task 6: Power Maths</u></b></p> <p>Learn all of your number bonds to 20 (16 + 4; 3 + 17 etc.). Make sure you can add to 20, and subtract from 20. How many number bonds are there?</p> <p>Consolidate your doubles and halves to 20</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 7: PSHE &amp; Art</u></b></p> <p>Write a list of people you can trust. Paint a picture of yourself with one of these people using the colour mixing knowledge you have learned!</p> <p>(Please note children will be looking at colour mixing and painting after the October half term)</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 8: Science</u></b></p> <p>Choose your favourite animal. Which animal group does it belong to? Can you draw a picture of it and add labels telling us what features it has that let you know which animal group it belongs to?</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 9: RE</u></b></p> <p>Get creative!</p> <p>Create something using materials of your choice that makes you proud.</p> <p>Remember to upload a photograph to twitter!</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Task 10: PE</u></b></p> <p>Can you throw and catch a ball 10 times in the air without dropping it? What about 20 times to a partner?</p> <p>Remember to upload a photograph to twitter!</p>
