

Year 1 Curriculum Newsletter

Autumn Term 2020

Welcome back to school after what I hope was a fantastic Summer break!



Topic

In Year 1, our exciting topics for the Autumn Term are called 'Land, Sea and Sky' and 'Hot and Cold'. In the first half of the term, children will develop their knowledge about describing landscape and why we celebrate Bonfire Night by researching Guy Fawkes. Following October half term, children will focus on British Geography and will take inspiration from the work of Wassily Kandinsky to create our own artwork. In Science, we will be learning all about 'Animals Including Humans'. We will develop our understanding around what makes us human and how we classify animals into groups by their individual features.



English

In the first half term, children will be focusing on the story 'The Bog Baby' and will start to make predictions about texts and provide reasoning for characters feelings and actions. Children will also start to use adjectives and nouns to develop their writing and correct sentence structure will be a focus throughout all English learning. After the October half term, we will be focusing on the story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. We will learn how to write fact files as part of non-fiction writing and focus on lists. Please see poster included in the homework wallets regarding our reading challenge.



Maths

This term, Year 1 will begin to deepen their understanding of number, what they represent and their place value. They will learn to sequence numbers and given any number to 100, identify one more and one less. The children will begin to solve addition and subtraction problems, using a range of methods for working out. They will broaden their knowledge of both 2D and 3D shapes by exploring their properties. We will also focus on Length, Mass and Weight using non-standard units of measure. The children will be able to broaden their knowledge of both 2D and 3D shapes by investigating and describing their properties. Following the October half term, we will also be looking at money and deepening our understanding of the aforementioned topics.



RE & Worship

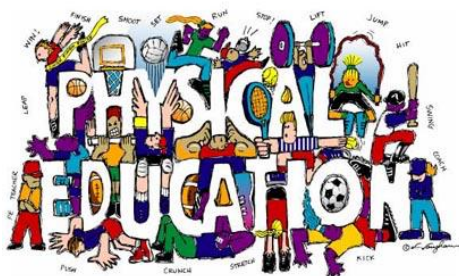
The topics in RE this term are 'Harvest', 'God and Creation' and 'Christmas' allowing children to explore their Christian religion in detail. Children will explore advent, different types of gifts and the meaning of Christmas. During worship, we will be placing a focus on the people of God from the Old Testament in God's Big Story.



PE

During our PE sessions for the Autumn term, we will place a large focus on Fundamental Skills across a range of activities. For the first

half term, we will also be focusing on throwing and catching. We will look at how to develop both our throwing and catching techniques and applying these to game situations.



Year 1 Notices

PE Kits: Please ensure that your child has an outdoor PE kit for the Autumn Term. This must be in school every day and should include either a navy blue or black tracksuit. Our PE days are Monday and Wednesday.

Water bottles: Every child needs their own water bottle with their name on. These can be refilled in school

Uniform: Please ensure that each item of uniform is clearly name labelled and that your child knows where these labels are to avoid your child losing anything.

How to help your child at home

Maths

- Practice 2 and 5 times tables daily
- Practice number bonds to 10 and 20
- Have an analogue clock in the house for children to begin learning telling the time

English

- Read with your child 4/5 times a week for 10 minutes and discuss what has been read
- Practice reading and writing tricky words
