You can draw a picture of the thing or things you're giving up, and say why you have chosen it.</p>	<p><u>Task 7: Art of Brilliance</u></p> <p>Put pen to paper for someone who has made a positive difference to you!</p> <p>If you can, read your letter to them and see their response!</p>	<p><u>Task 8: Geography</u></p> <p>During this term we will be learning all about our local area, Charnock Richard.</p> <p>What interesting things can you find out about Charnock Richard? What was it like in the past? Maybe you could interview some family members or neighbours and see what they remember, they might even have some interesting photographs. Create a fact file with all the interesting things you find out.</p>	<p><u>Task 9: Science</u></p> <p>This term we will be learning all about the uses of everyday materials. Try building houses for the three little pigs, just like in the story. Try making predictions and then test them.</p> <p>Remember to post some photos on Twitter!</p>	<p><u>Task 10: Outdoors/RE</u></p> <p>Choose a clear night for this task!
