<p><u>Task 1 - Maths</u></p> <p>Chunking Problems—Solve the division problems attached.</p> <p>If your child needs help please get them to ask in school.</p> <hr/> <p>Continue practising times tables on Times Table Rockstars.</p>	<p><u>Task 2 - Maths</u></p> <p><i>Reasoning Problems</i> - Complete the attached questions on negative numbers, place value and addition and subtraction. (p6, p7, p8, p12, p13)</p> <p>If your child is stuck on any questions they can ask for help in school.</p>	<p><u>Task 3 - English</u></p> <p><i>Reading</i> - Read a book by an author you have never heard of before.</p> <p>Once finished, write a review of the book using the outline provided. We will collect them all in for a display for our reading corner.</p> <p>See the suggested reading list attached for ideas. Most of these books are available in school.</p>	<p><u>Task 4 - English</u></p> <p><i>Grammar</i> - Complete the attached grammar and punctuation questions.</p> <p>If your child is stuck on any questions they can ask for help in school.</p> <hr/> <p><i>Spelling</i> - Every Friday children will be given a new spelling rule to practise on www.spellingframe.co.uk</p> <p>Spend some time each week practising these spellings.</p>	<p><u>Task 5 - Young Leaders</u></p> <p>Starting from Thursday 12th January children will be required to do one of Archie's tasks per week until at least seven are completed.</p> <p>Please could books be brought in every Thursday.</p> <p>Work will be stuck in their Young Leader's book and more information will follow soon.</p>
<p><u>Task 6 - Science</u></p> <p>Complete the 'Solar System Fact Hunt' activity. You can research using books, the internet, or the Solar System Fact cards on Showbie.</p>	<p><u>Task 7 - Topic</u></p> <p><i>Rivers</i> - Lots of wildlife depend on our rivers to survive. Find out about a river dependent creature and create a fact file about it.</p> <p>Some ideas: otters, water voles, different species of fish, ducks or birds.</p>	<p><u>Task 8 - Art</u></p> <p><i>Painting / Drawing</i> - With a link to our art topic of JMW Turner, and our geography topic of rivers, either paint or draw a landscape including some water!</p> <p>It could be the sea, a river, a pond or a lake.</p>	<p><u>Task 9 - Being Brilliant</u></p> <p><i>Interview</i>—Interview the happiest person you know. Write down one key thing you can learn from them and try and apply this in the future.</p> <p>Write up the interview in your book or on a computer/tablet.</p>	<p><u>Task 10 - RE</u></p> <p>Create a storyboard to show the events of Holy Week (Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday).</p> <p>Use writing and pictures.
