Our next step

The Internet is a wonderful tool in our fast paced world when used safely and responsibly. It is therefore important that we ensure our children are aware of the risks and use it appropriately. 59% of KS2 children say they use the internet every day and 15% of children in Year 1 and Year 2 say they use it every day too.

A significant number of children said they were using social networking sites, all of which have minimum age requirements starting beyond primary aged children.

For your information the age restrictions are as follows:

- Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat, Oovoo and Musical.ly all have a minimum age of 13
- Skype recommends 13 but there is no legal requirement
- WhatsApp is 16
- YouTube has a minimum age of 18 but reduces to 13 with parental permission

As a school we continue to raise the profile of E-Safety with age appropriate lessons taught both discretely and through other units. In addition, we also have classroom displays, termly assemblies and regular reminders whenever using the internet. We will also be hosting an E-Safety talk for parents in November, in partnership with the NSPCC, which we hope will address any concerns they may have regarding parental settings and age restrictions.
