This term your child will be learning all about 'On the Farm'.

PSHE (personal, social and emotional development)

This term the PHSE theme is 'It's OK to Tell'. The children will talk about their feelings and discuss the differences between us all and how we and animals develop and grow.

Literacy

A stimulus for our writing will be our trip to Farmer Ted's. The children will be writing a recount of what they saw and did. They will be starting their writing with the words first, then, next and last. The children will continue to be encouraged to write in sentences using a capital letter and full stops.

We will be using different picture books as a stimulus for our work during this half term like 'Dear Zoo and 'What the Ladybird Heard'.

PE

Your child will be having PE on **Monday and Thursday**. They will be learning outdoor games, practising our races for sport's day and practising our bat and ball skills. The children will also be having some Football First sessions.

Maths

We will continue to discover bigger numbers and counting in 10's, 5's and 2's. We are working on recognising and using money to add and take away. They will use 10p to count in 10s and working how to make 10p in lots of different ways. We will continue to use base 10 and units to make bigger numbers. We are also

looking at weight/ capacity/ shape and pattern.

KUW

We will be going to Farmer Ted's Farm and going on a tractor ride and exploring the animals and finding out what they eat, where they sleep etc. We will be learning facts about the animals and talking about babies and their mummies. We will also be looking at how vegetables grow and what they need. Mrs Slaney will be starting a gardening club with the children this term. All of the vegetables and salad that is grown is given to the school kitchen to use.

EAD

We will be using different media to create pictures and collages to go with our topic. We will also continue to use junk to make our own models.
