Proposed Pupil Premium spend 2019/20

For the financial year 2019/20 the school will receive £23,680. The school will fund the following areas:

- To continue to fund 1 teaching assistant for Lunchtime Nurture Group (x3 per week) who provide support for vulnerable pupils who find unstructured play difficult. As a result of this, these pupils have a much calmer, productive lunchtime and are better able to access afternoon school as they are in a better frame of mind to learn. **(£1,850)**
- To fund extra-curricular music through Lancashire Music Service involvement guitar tuition for Y6 pupils and ukulele. **(£2,975)**
- To fund additional Welfare Staff at lunch time so that there is a large enough team to supervise and engage with each year group and ensure a smooth, productive lunchtime. **(£2,520)**
- To fund intervention group support in Year 6 **(£3,200)**
- To cover short falls in funding when providing enrichment opportunities such as educational visits and/or visitors in to school. This means that almost all planned enhanced learning opportunities can go ahead and no child is excluded (for reasons of parental hardship) from them. **(£1,440)**
- To help fund class teacher costs so we are able to maintain seven classes, reducing pupil numbers in Key stage 2. **(£ 8,035)**

What is the Pupil Premium?

This is funding given to schools for every child who has free school meals. The government provides this funding because it believes there is a strong link between the financial background of families and their children's achievement.

The government provide funding for children

- who have been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years (£1320)
- who have been previously looked after, subject of a special guardianship order and/or adopted from care (£1.900)
- whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces (£300).

How does the school access the money?

School completes a census several times a year indicating how many children have free school meals. The funding is multiplied by the number of children.
