<p align="center"><u>Task 1: English</u></p> <p>Write your own story! This can be about anything you can dream of and can be as short or long as you wish. Make sure to include a clear beginning, middle and end. Each story should include at least 1 question from a character, remember your question marks! I hope to see perfect sentences that each have a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop or question mark at the end.</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 2: Phonics</u></p> <p>Complete the split digraph challenge! Children need to name the object in the picture in the box adjacent to it. Each word will include the split digraph at the top of the column. After completion children should use the back of the sheet to write a minimum of 5 sentences including some of the words they have identified. Please note: Some children are beginning to learn split digraphs on our return to school and therefore may not recognize them all immediately. They will be able to complete this activity as the term progresses.</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 3: Reading</u></p> <p>Read for 10 minutes, at least 5 times a week. Make sure that you are reading clearly, sounding out all of the phonemes. Keep this recorded in your Reading Record.</p> <p>Take on our Year 1 Reading Challenge! Remember to keep track of the books you have read.</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 4: Maths</u></p> <p>Learn your 5 times tables. Make sure you can count in 5s and multiply by 5! Practice counting in 5s with objects around the home, such as gloves or dried pasta!</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 5: Maths</u></p> <p>Help someone cook/bake! Can you use scales to measure the exact amount of ingredients? Can you help an adult figure out how to share your food out equally? For example 12 cupcakes shared between 4 people would mean 3 each! Yum Yum! Don't forget to upload a photograph to twitter or Class Dojo showing you using math's to help you!</p>
<p align="center"><u>Task 6: RE</u></p> <p>Jesus was special because he performed miracles. Draw or paint a picture of Jesus performing your favourite miracle. Be as creative as you can!</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 7: PSHE – Art of Brilliance</u></p> <p align="center">Learn a new skill!</p> <p>Keep a learning record over 2 weeks to see how much progress you make. This could be written, pictures or videos. Pick any skill you like but here is some inspiration...</p> <p>Learn to hoola hoop, colour inside the lines, skip with a skipping rope, shoot a ball into a basketball hoop, dance a full routine, ride your bike or scooter.</p> <p>Remember to stay resilient and make sure you pick a skill that is entirely new to you!</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 8: Science</u></p> <p>Go on a materials hunt around your house! What objects can you find that are made from the materials on the list provided?</p> <p>Send the list back to school or send a picture to Miss Howarth on Class Dojo or Twitter of you on your material hunt!</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 9: Art</u></p> <p>Go on a sculpture hunt! When you are out and about see if you can find any sculptures in the area. Can you figure out what the sculpture is made from? Remember to upload a photograph to twitter!</p>	<p align="center"><u>Task 10: PE</u></p> <p>Can you practice one of your gymnastics travel moves in a strange place? You could choose any from the travelling options we have learned in our gymnastics lessons</p>
