(there is also a copy on the school website)</p> <p>Practise spelling these words and find out meanings of any words you do not know.</p> <p><i>Please note: There will be an assessment on the lists during the assessment week in December.</i></p>	<p>Write a letter to a famous person.</p> <p>In the past, we have had some amazing success with this challenge - we even got onto the Rock FM Breakfast Show as one child wrote to Steve and Janine! We've had some wonderful and inspirational replies from Lindsay Hoyle (the Chorley politician) and even a handwritten letter from Pep Guardiola too!</p> <p>Think carefully about who you will write your letter to as replies have taken up to 18 months! I would get stuck into this task straight away.</p> <p>Top tip: to give you more chance of receiving a reply include SAE with your letter.</p>	<p>Task 1: To support the class, Let's Read sessions. Children must read x 3 sessions a week for at least 30 minutes.</p> <p>Task 2: Children need to complete a book review. It could be on the class novel or their favourite book.</p> <p>Task 3: <i>The Big October Read</i> - read as many books as you can in October. Keep a record. <i>There will be prizes!</i></p> <p>Task 4: The Year 6 Reading Challenge! The books are: The Hobbit by JRR Tolkien, Holes by Louis Sachar and How to train your dragon by Cressida Cowell.</p>	<p>Complete the division sheet (short division with no remainders and short division practice worksheet).</p> <p>Complete the adding fractions and subtracting fractions sheet.</p> <p><i>*Please note I will be teaching division and adding/ subtracting fractions during Autumn 1 therefore I recommend completing these sheets in Autumn 2*</i></p>	<p>Write a collection of prayers and display in a book. Please include illustrations and present the final book to a very high standard.</p> <p>These will be proudly displayed on the class worship area and some will be given to Church and/ or the Alms Houses as a gift at the end of the school term.</p> <p><i>Please note: This is my favourite homework task. Every year the books have been of the highest standard and received with great delight by the Church and residents of the Alms Houses. Some children actually received letters and cards of thanks. Please take time and care when making your prayer book.</i></p>
