<p><u>Task 1: Writing</u></p> <p>Write an imaginative story about a magical door in a tree.</p> <p>See the sheet included with homework pack for more details.</p>	<p><u>Task 2: Reading</u></p> <p>Read at home at least three times a week for 15 minutes.</p> <p>After you finish each book write a short review in your homework book.</p>	<p><u>Task 3: Maths</u></p> <p>Complete the sets of arithmetic questions (sheets included with homework pack).</p> <p>There are six sets of questions.</p>	<p><u>Task 4: Maths</u></p> <p>Three times a week spend 15mins practising times tables on Times Table Rockstars.</p>	<p><u>Task 5: Spelling</u></p> <p>Three times a week spend 15 minutes practising your spelling on Spelling Frame.</p> <p>Spellings will change every Friday after school.</p>
<p><u>Task 6: Science</u></p> <p>With help from an adult, identify some reversible and irreversible changes at home. Draw what happened or take a picture, and say whether it was reversible or irreversible.</p> <p>Ideas: Ice lollies melting / freezing, a kettle boiling, baking a cake, cooking egg.</p> <p>Can you get it back the way it was?</p>	<p><u>Task 7: Art of Brilliance</u></p> <p>Make a bookmark containing your very own individual list of 'importance'. Order the following things:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Money • Family • Happiness • Love • School • Friends • Health • Fresh Air 	<p><u>Task 8: History</u></p> <p>Create a fact file about Henry VIII.</p> <p>Things to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who his parents were. • When he was born/ died. • The names of his wives / what happened to them. • Any other interesting facts. 	<p><u>Task 9: RE</u></p> <p>Think of ways you have demonstrated the school's Christian values of Trust, Koinonia, Compassion, Love, Thankfulness, Forgiveness and Service. Write them down in your homework book.</p> <p>E.g. Trust—I showed trust in my little sister when I let her play with my toy even though I was worried it may break.</p>	<p><u>Task 10: Art</u></p> <p>Draw or paint a surreal landscape picture.
